INTRODUCTION

This collection of sermons and other papers was donated to the Congregational Library by Douglas Horton's daughter-in-law, Mrs. Joan Horton. The materials arrived in two cardboard cartons, with little or no order to the contents. Personal letters were copied and the originals returned to the donor, as requested. Additional materials may be sent by the donor in 1994.

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

Douglas Horton was born in Brooklyn, New York, on July 27, 1891. He attended Princeton, where he earned his bachelor of arts degree; pursued graduate studies at New College in Edinburgh, Scotland, at Mansfield College, Oxford and at the University of Tuebingen, Germany; and earned his bachelor of divinity at Hartford Seminary. He received numerous honorary degrees over the course of his career.

Ordained in the Congregational Church on December 13, 1915, Horton served as Assistant Pastor and then Pastor at the First Church in Middletown, Connecticut, from 1915-1924. He then moved to Brookline, Massachusetts, where he led the Leyden Church from 1925-1931, and from there to Chicago, Illinois, and the United Church of Hyde Park from 1931-1938. His activities at the denominational level included minister and secretary of both the General Council and the National Council from 1938-1955.

Horton was also an educator and a writer. He taught at such institutions as Newton Theological Institution and the Chicago Theological Seminary. From 1955-1960 he served as dean of the Harvard Divinity School. His publications include numerous articles, several translations from German and Latin, and monographs on religion, with such titles as The Art of Living Today; Congregationalism, a Study in Church Policy; and The Meaning of Worship.

Horton died in Randolph, New Hampshire August 21, 1968. For more information, see the article in <u>Who Was Who</u>, volume 5, page 348-9. See the card catalog for books by Horton which are in the library.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The bulk of this collection consists of sermons, handwritten and tyescript, written by Douglas Horton between about 1920 and 1935. Most are undated. They are arranged in Series A alphabetically by title, if the title is known. Fragments, and sermons with no or an indecipherable title, are arranged at the end of the sermons. An index of titles is appended to this finding aid.

Also included in Series A are other examples of Horton's writing, namely prayers, translations, articles, a transcript of a diary and a narrative of a family trip to Europe, as well as notes, "jottings," and other research materials used to prepare sermons or write articles and books. One group of materials appears to date from his years at Seminary, although the date and provenance are not entirely clear.

Series B consists of correspondence, a mix of personal and business letters, dating 1919-1941. The letters from 1919 relate Horton's impressions

of Europe while serving as a U.S. Navy Chaplain. In 1941 he made a trip across the United States and the letters from that period document his impressions of his own country. Business letters include correspondence with publishers concerning books and articles. Horton had separate files for correspondence with the <u>Congregational Quarterly</u>, 1930-1931, and with Harper's Magazine, 1929, and these files have been maintained.

The final series, Series C, encompasses records and memorabilia from the churches where Horton was pastor, as well as materials from his denominational work and as an educator. The records of the Middletown Church consist of the constitution. Leyden Church records include his installation program, some membership materials, and notes on a pastor's class he held. Reports on the actions of the Commission on Missions date from 1929-1931. Horton was invited twice to give seminars on worship, and materials relating to these seminars are included in Series C. Memorabilia include a program of a church service from the U.S. Navy, 1919; and a memorial leaflet for a young man who died in 1935.
