BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

Harry Edgar Tweedy was born in Brookville, Pennsylvania in 1858. He attended Franklin College in Ohio and was ordained on April 7, 1909, in the Congregational Church in Wallace, Nebraska. He spent the rest of his life ministering to the needs of congregations throughout Nebraska, serving a total of seven churches before his retirement to Meron, Indiana, where he died in 1941.
