Abstract:	Cope, Colorado, was named after Johnathan C. Cope, an officer of the Burlington Railroad Company. The Cope Congregational Church, according to Richard Taylor, was founded in 1896 and closed in 1910 and Taylor states that Happy Valley Congregational Church was founded in 1917 and closed in 1919. This collection contains a series of photographs that depict various buildings from in and around Cope, Colorado.

Historical Note

Cope, Colorado, was named after Johnathan C. Cope, an officer of the Burlington Railroad Company who was sent by the company to the area to homestead a railroad terminal site. Cope Colorado has had an operational post office since 1889. The Cope Congregational Church, according to Richard Taylor, was founded in 1896 and closed in 1910. Also, according to Taylor, there was a Happy Valley Congregational Church in Cope from 1917 to 1919. These churches may have been succeeded by the Cope Community Church which is active today.
