<b>Abstract:</b>	<p>Minnie E. Carter was born in Redding, Connecticut on June 13, 1886. She was a member of the First Congregational Church of Bethel, participating in the choir, the Sunshine Society, and was a Sunday School teacher. In 1916, Minnie would leave the United States and live in South Africa at the Inanda Seminary. Minnie would remain at Inanda Seminary from 1916 through her retirement in 1957. While at Inanda, Minnie would teach on a variety of subjects including the Bible, English, Mathematics, Biology, and serve as a substitute teacher as needed. Minnie would return to the United States permanently in 1957 following her retirement. After returning, she served as a deaconess for the First Congregational Church in Bethel, organized prayer groups, and visited members of the community who typically stayed in their homes. Minnie E. Carter died on September 29th, 1974. This collection contains various subject files and photographs from Minnie Carter's time working for the Inanda Seminary in South Africa under the American Board of Commissioners for Foreign Missions from 1917-1957.</p>

## Biographical Information

---

Minnie E. Carter was born in Redding, Connecticut on June 13, 1886. Her family moved to Bethel, Connecticut when she was 3. She graduated as a valedictorian at Bethel High School in 1904 and also graduated from Danbury Normal School in 1906. She was a member of the First Congregational Church of Bethel, participating in the choir, the Sunshine Society, and was a Sunday School teacher.

Minnie taught elementary grades from 1906 to 1915 in Bridgewater, Bethel, and Stamford, Connecticut. From 1915 to 1916, she attended the New York Biblical Seminary in New York City. In May of 1915, Minnie and 54 other missionaries from the American Board of Commissioners for Foreign Missions (ABCFM) participated in a Farewell Service at the Second Congregational Church in Dorchester. A year later, she leaves the United States to live in South Africa at the Inanda Seminary.

The Inanda Seminary is an all-girls school located about 20 miles north of the city of Durban. The school was founded by Daniel and Lucy Lindley in 1869 and continues to operate as of 2026. Minnie would remain at Inanda Seminary from 1916 through her retirement in 1957, excluding some furloughs that took place in 1926, 1938, and 1949. While at Inanda, Minnie would teach on a variety of subjects including the Bible, English, Mathematics, Biology, and serve as a substitute teacher as needed. She also supervised a number of extracurricular activities like drama and sports, introduced a library in 1927, and organized Sunday School training for students. After serving as interim principle from 1928-1929, she was the head teacher from 1930-1948.

Minnie would return to the United States permanently in 1957 following her retirement. After returning, she served as a deaconess for the First Congregational Church in Bethel, organized prayer groups, and visited members of the community who typically stayed in their homes. Minnie E. Carter died on September 29th, 1974.
